

Scrimshaw By Bill Martin

Bill Martin began his program by calling us into a circle around him and proceeded to give us a detailed look into the art of Scrimshaw from it's history down to the art form itself!

The word Scrimshaw comes from "scrimshank" which means "to ignore ones duties". The art form originated on whaling ships using the bones and teeth of whales. They used sharp objects to scratch pictures into ivory.

Bill named several sources to find ivory including Whale teeth, elephant tusks, boar tusks, wart hog tusks, the top of a hornbill's head, elk teeth and hippo teeth!

Even though ivory is found in the teeth and horns of many animals, laws to protect animals from being killed for the ivory have made it very hard to come by and therefore quite expensive. If you purchase ivory make sure you go to a

seller who can provide you a document stating the ivory was obtained before 1970, otherwise it is illegal! You can also scrimshaw on beef bone, plastic, baleen, nautilus shells, antlers, vegetable ivory, tagua nuts and other polymers that can be buffed to a glasslike shine.

Preparing the surface for scrimshaw is very important. The ivory (or other surface to be scrimshawed) must be buffed to a perfect shine or your artwork may yellow.

After the surface is prepared, choose a pattern and transfer it to the surface of your ivory.

Using a sharp point, scratch the lines of the pattern. Shading can be done using stippling or crosshatching. The closer the lines or stipples are together, the darker the shading will be. Bill even said he is going to spend money (a feat in itself for Bill) and buy an air operated hand held tool to do stippling!

Once the pattern is completely scratched into the ivory, ink is applied to the piece and then wiped off leaving color only in the scratches. Soot tar, oil paint, permanent markers, tobacco juice, or berry juice can also be used to color the piece as an alternative to ink.

Bill will be teaching a class on scrimshaw in Honesdale at the annual Woodcarver's Roundup in Honesdale next week!
